

Grants for Neighborhoods Programs

The Grants for Neighborhoods is a matching grant program of the City of Savannah which is directed towards enhancing and maintaining the livability and quality of life in the City's Target Neighborhoods. The idea of the grant program is to encourage self-help neighborhood improvement efforts and support initiatives to make improvements. This program gives neighborhood-based organizations an incentive to raise funds, build partnerships with businesses and organizations, cultivate volunteer and community support to complete a project, and act as active developers of their communities. Successful applicants can receive grants from \$5,000 up to \$10,000 in CDBG funds. The neighborhood associations will contribute 25% of the resources, such as volunteer time, cash contributions, and donated materials, to match the funding sought from the City of Savannah.

Who can apply/eligibility?

Only neighborhood-based groups in the designated ***CDBG Target Area that have become Community-Based Development Organizations (CBDO)*** are eligible for the grants.

Groups must:

- \$ Be incorporated under the Laws of the State of Georgia.
- \$ Have non-profit 501 (c)(3)
- \$ Represent a geographic area such as a neighborhood or a cluster of neighborhoods, not the entire city.
